Internal Engagements

- Data Driven Election Analysis (DDEA) (POL 211): This course was co-taught by Gilles Verniers and Sudheendra Hangal semester. Saloni Bhogale Teaching Fellow for the course. The course was designed to introduce students to electoral analysis by combining political parties' genealogies with a data-driven approach to political transformations. On account of the 17th General Elections, this course offered an opportunity to acquire the skills required to handle political data, from data handling and cleaning to data visualization and political cartography. It also addressed a number of key questions pertaining to political representation - the role of caste, women and minority representation, the changing profile of elected representatives - through data as well as through the literature. Two students share their experience below:

Niharika Tiwari (UG 2020): DDEA was a very unique course. Students could explore more about Indian politics and elections and also learn how to read, analyse and project trends. I loved working with the different tools that we learnt in class. The course also helped me realize my love for data and how I can bring together Computer Science and Political science. The tools that we learnt in class also helped me expand my skill set and use these tools in other internships and courses, as I can now make data to support my arguments, unlike having to spend hours looking for a certain type of map pr graph.

Vaibhav Parik (UG 2020): I think the best part about the course was that it is not just learning to handle and manipulate huge datasets, but also the sheer understanding you develop looking and trying to make sense of data. I enjoyed how the software we learnt in the technical modules, was supplemented with critical themes during elections. It was a great mix of acquiring data skills alongside a political insight on how elections work, which made me learn how to generate data and being able to say things about it.
