DATA RELEASE: TCPD INDIAN COUNCIL OF MINISTERS DATASET

The TCPD-ICoM: Indian Council of Ministers Dataset contains information on the Indian Council of Ministers between 1990 and 2019.

The data has been carefully extracted and verified from the official website of the Cabinet Secretariat and a publication of the Lok Sabha secretariat titled "कौन सा पद रखा (1947 - 2011)" which documents the names and portfolios allotted to ministers in this time period.

We table it in an orderly manner in order to systematically place the information under variables such as name of the candidates, election year, party name, gender, portfolio, rank, start date of appointment, end date of appointment, and constituency.

Moreover, it has also incorporated various minister shuffles between the terms. The data also mentions the sources of information for each instance captured, so that users can verify the same.

UPDATE: WOMENS' REPRESENTATION PROJECT

The Womens' Representation Project is a study of the motivations of elected female (and male) representatives at the panchayat level in Haryana.



The study aims to understand how female political ambition differs from that of men and compare the factors that motivate entry into politics for both men and women.

The project has been completed under the supervision of Gilles Verniers, Susan Ostermann (University of Notre Dame) and Sampurna Khasnabis.
